- › Why did you decide to become an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Worker or Health Practitioner?
- › What does the day-to-day life of an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Worker/Practitioner look like in your community/clinic/service?
- › What does having a National Day of Recognition for the workforce mean to you?
- › What is your advice to young people considering becoming an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Health Worker or Health Practitioner?
- › How does your role contribute to the health sector and other health professionals?
- › How can the health sector or other health professionals support your role?
- › Can you share any stories or memories of a time when you felt you really had an impact on your client, workplace or community?



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
